

**CLASSES OF ENTRY** One container only to be used in Classes 1-19, vase, bowl or glass as appropriate

- ROSES**
1. One specimen bloom to be judged on scent
  2. Large-flowered, one stem
  3. Large-flowered, 3 stems, one or more varieties
  4. Cluster-flowered – one stem
- DAHLIAS**
5. Giant or Large – 3 blooms, over 220mm. in diameter
  6. Medium or Small Decorative – 5 blooms, 115-220mm. in diameter
  7. Medium or Small Cactus or semi-Cactus – 3 blooms, 115-220mm.
  8. Pompon (less than 52mm.) or Miniature Ball (less than 115mm.), 5 blooms
  9. A container of Dahlias arranged for effect – any number or variety
- CHRYSANTHEMUMS**
10. A container of Chrysanthemums arranged for effect – any number or variety
- TREES OR SHRUBS**
11. Flowering – 3 stems, one kind only
  12. Berried or fruiting – 3 stems, one kind only
  13. Foliage – 3 stems, one or more kinds
- HYDRANGEAS**
14. Mophead – one stem
  15. Lace cap – one stem
- OTHER FLOWERS**
16. Garden flowers, annuals or biennials, one kind
  17. Garden flowers, perennials not included in previous classes, one kind
  18. Ornamental grasses and/or bamboo canes
  19. Mixed flowers, at least 2 kinds, 7 stems
  20. 5 flower heads, one kind only, displayed in box provided
- POT PLANTS**
21. Flowering (pot not exceeding 150mm.)
  22. Flowering (pot over 150mm.)
  23. Foliage (any size pot)

In Fruit & Veg. classes, over-sized or under-sized exhibits will not be disqualified, but will be down-pointed. Each exhibit must be of one variety only. Onions may be from seed or sets, but not a mixture of both.

- FRUIT**
24. Apples, dessert – 5 (not exceeding 80mm. diameter) **Named if possible**
  25. Apples, culinary – 5 (not less than 80mm. diameter)
  26. Pears – 3 **Named if possible**
  27. Raspberries (with stalks) – one dish of 20
  28. Grapes, one bunch
  29. Any other fruit – one dish

- VEGETABLES**
30. Potatoes – 5 white, **named variety**
  31. Potatoes – 5 other than white, **named variety**
  32. Marrows, long – a pair
  33. Courgettes – a pair. Long – 100 – 200mm. in length.
  34. Squash, summer or winter, excluding pumpkin – a single specimen  
**(Custard Marrows and Spaghetti Marrows are classed as Squashes)**

35. Pumpkin, a single specimen (condition as important as size)
36. Beetroot – 3 globe
37. Carrots – 3, any type, (no minimum length)
38. Onions – 3, 250g. and under
39. Onions – 3, over 250g.
40. Leeks - 3
41. Shallots – 5
42. Parsnips – 2
43. Tomatoes – medium – 3 (approximately 65mm. diameter)
44. Tomatoes – small fruited or cherry – 7 ( not exceeding 35mm.) in a dish of sand
45. Tomatoes – large – one specimen (not less than 75mm.)
46. Tomatoes – fancy – 3 (yellow, striped or other unusual colour or variety)
47. Peppers, sweet – 2 (any matching shape or colour)
48. Runner Beans – 6 pods
49. French Beans (dwarf or climbing) – 6 pods
50. Sweet corn – 2 cobs (one segment of husk pulled down to show grains)
51. Any other kind of vegetable not listed above
52. **“September Harvest”**, a collection of vegetables displayed in a basket, to be judged on presentation, quality and variety.
53. Three culinary Herbs (not flowering) cut, in water and named

**FLORAL ART** (Space for each exhibit 60cms square. Open staging)

54. **“Harvest Time”**. May include fruit, veg, corn, seed heads, etc.
55. **“Petite”** – an exhibit in baby booties (not to exceed 25cm height & width)

**COOKERY**

56. Victoria Sponge (3 egg) with jam filling
57. Blackberry Pie
58. Three Cheese Scones, plain cutter and glazed.
59. Cold Sweet or Pudding

**PRESERVES**

No commercial name to appear on any container or lid. Either a metal twist top (with inner plastic coating for pickles) or waxed disc and cellophane may be used. Wax disc not needed with metal lids, but there must be a seal of preservation.

60. A jar of jam, made from any of this season's fruit
61. A jar of chutney
62. A jar of fruit jelly
63. A jar of marmalade

## AUTUMN SHOW RULES

1. All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor. The exhibitor must have cultivated the fruit/ vegetables/ flowers (excluding Floral Art) themselves. Exhibits in all other sections must have been made by the exhibitor. Pot plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least two months.
2. Class cards will be furnished on the morning of the Show and the exhibitors will be responsible for the correct placing of the cards.
3. Exhibitors must provide their own receptacles, unless otherwise stated.
4. No exhibitor may enter more than 1 exhibit in any one class. Each exhibitor must use a separate entry form (copies available on website or at usual local outlets).
5. The hall will be open from 9:00 to 11:00 am for exhibitors to place their exhibits. **No late entries will be accepted.** No exhibits may be removed before 4:00 pm.
6. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry without assigning a reason and the right to inspect any exhibitor's garden or allotment.
7. Judges may withhold a prize at their discretion or give an award according to the merit of the exhibit.
8. Judging of classes 2 – 53 will be conducted according to the Royal Horticultural Society Rules, 2008 handbook. A copy of this book will be available at the Show Secretary's desk.
9. Any objections must be made in writing to the Secretary of the Society before 3:00 pm on the day of the Show.
10. While taking every reasonable care, the Committee will not hold itself responsible for any loss of, or damage to, exhibits.
11. Any question or dispute arising not covered by these Rules and Regulations shall be settled by the Committee, whose discretion shall be final.
12. No cup offered for competition on points shall be awarded to the same competitor more than three times running. No cup shall be awarded to anyone residing outside a 15 – mile radius of Uplyme Village Hall. A certificate may be awarded instead.
